Other pads: Bienfang Graphic 360; Borden & Riley Marker Pads; Rhodia Pads

Quality Laserjet paper

Good quality papers (for finished work: sized, acid-free)

Arches Text Wove (Velin) - durable, good tooth, colors absorb more than watercolor papers

Arches 90# or 140# Watercolor Papers (hot press, cold press, rough) - good for wet media, inks

Many fine papers available through John Neal, Bookseller

Note: If paper is not sized, pouncing with gum sandarac will help avoid ink bleed)

Other substrates to try: canvas board, canvas, cradled wood panels
